About the Art of Ethical Butchering Workshop

Are you curious about where bacon on your plate came from? Learn from Michael Kelly of Treebird Farm about the art of ethically raising, harvesting, and butchering pigs. Treebird Farm is a family farm in Trout Lake, WA, and raises high quality, planet-friendly pork, chicken, lamb, beef, and eggs using permaculture and sustainable agriculture practices. Spend a day learning from Michael about his farming practices and how to process an entire pig, from whole animal to a sausage and bacon ready to eat. You will get to practice butchering cuts and take home 5 lbs of sausage you make with your own spice blend. Option to participate in the harvesting (killing) of the pig on Friday, March 22 for free. When you register, please note if you are interested in attending the harvest and we will send you the time for the harvest. Please plan to participate in the whole harvest.
